

CONTENT REQUIREMENTS FOR HEBREW LICENSURE

The courses below cover the state-mandated competencies for multi-age licensure in Hebrew (grades K-12) and should be completed at the undergraduate level prior to beginning the Master of Education teacher preparation program. At least 68 quarter hours (45 for native speakers) of course work covering language proficiency and analysis, linguistics, literature, and culture are required with a minimum GPA of 3.0. Any substitutions require written faculty approval based on review of syllabi or detailed course descriptions.
