Master of Education (M.Ed.) Leading to Ohio Teacher Licensure Social Studies and Global Education Grades 7-12

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Baccalaureate degree from an accredited institution
- Minimum 3.0 overall GPA (on a 4.0 scale) in all previous undergraduate and graduate coursework (**may not be combined since calculated separately**) as well as in social studies content.
- Completion of undergraduate content courses. (Content List can be found on our website: <http://ehe.osu.edu/edtl/>). **Include the Plan for completing remaining content courses, which is also located online.**
- Preference may be given to applicants with cross-cultural or international experience and experiences working with adolescents in a learning situation, preferably in a 7-12 social studies classroom
- Official scores from the General Test of the Graduate Record Exam (GRE) taken within five years of application
- TOEFL score for international students, if required (minimum score 550 paper-based, 213 computer-based, or 79 iBT)
- Statement of Intent: See “Application Checklist” for format and instructions, located online.
- Three letters of recommendation from persons acquainted with your academic performance, your experiences with children, and your potential as a teacher. Include at least one letter from a professor or instructor who has had you in class. Recommendations written on letterhead stationery should be attached to the Graduate School Reference Form.
- Resume listing work history, military experience, academic accomplishments, paid or volunteer experiences working with adolescents, related extracurricular experiences, and honors or awards (limit two pages for fellowship)

THE SOCIAL STUDIES AND GLOBAL EDUCATION

The M.Ed. teacher preparation program is a full-time, graduate program that may be completed in four quarters if all content courses are finished prior to entry and students begin in the summer. The program may take longer if content courses are not completed prior to entry. The program consists of a coherent series of interdisciplinary core courses, methods, seminars, a research and inquiry component, extensive field experiences, a clinical practicum, and a culminating project that focuses on critical issues in social studies education. The University faculty works closely with practicing teachers in Franklin County in our Professional Development School Network in Social Studies & Global Education to provide authentic learning and assessments during field work and student teaching.

DEADLINE FOR ADMISSIONS

- Apply by **December 1** to be considered for admission Summer or Autumn Quarter. Students who wish to complete the program in one year must begin Summer Quarter. Students who have not completed all of the content may take two years to complete the M.Ed. Applications will be considered after the deadline if space remains available.

SCHOLARSHIPS & FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

- Students who have a cumulative undergraduate GPA of 3.6 or above, score a 75th percentile average between the Verbal and Quantitative sections of the GRE, and score a 4.0 or above in the Writing section of the GRE may be eligible for a **University Fellowship**, which will pay tuition and a monthly stipend for four full-time quarters. To be considered for a fellowship, completed admissions applications and all required documentation must be received **prior to January 1 (November 30 for international applicants)**. To be competitive, applicants who wish to be considered for a fellowship should submit three letters of recommendation from professors regarding their academic potential, one letter regarding their potential as teachers, and a resume including academic accomplishments (limit two pages).

COMPETITIVE ADMISSION

The M.Ed. is a competitive program. Meeting the minimum standards does not guarantee admission. Applicants who have completed most or all of their content courses may be given preference for admission. The admissions committee also considers experiences with diverse student populations in grades 7-12 classrooms as well as diversity in the range of applicants related to gender, race/ethnicity, and life experience.

UNDERGRADUATE PREPARATION

Content courses should be completed at the undergraduate level prior to beginning the M.Ed. program (see the content sheet for Integrated Social Studies). Eighty-five percent of the social studies content must be completed prior to the internship quarter of the M.Ed. One course each in history, geography, and political science may be completed after the internship; however, all content must be completed prior to licensure. Undergraduate students at OSU may choose to major in a subject such as history or political science and minor in geography, or they may choose to combine history, political science, and sociology courses in a Personalized Study Program (PSP) as their undergraduate major and minor in geography. GEC courses and electives also may be used to fulfill the content requirements. OHIO REQUIREMENTS FOR PROVISIONAL LICENSURE

- Completion of undergraduate content courses
- Completion of the approved teacher preparation program
- Signed statement of good moral character as defined by the Ohio Board of Education: “A person shall be deemed to be of good moral character provided that said individual has not pleaded guilty to or been convicted of a felony”
- Fingerprinting and personal background check
- Passing scores on the PRAXIS II National Teacher Exams

Licensure requirements may be subject to change due to state-legislated mandates. Prospective students are encouraged to contact the School of Teaching and Learning each year to ensure they have the most up-to-date information.
