RECENT TEACHING EXPERIENCE: 1996-2004

HM 230, Introduction to Hospitality Management (developed the course), teaching course Au, Wi, Sp quarters. Enrollment currently 60-80 students per quarter. Average student evaluation, SEI, scores approximately 4.8/5.0.

HM 551, Introductory Internship in Hospitality Management, Foodservice/Restaurants. (developed the course), teaching with assistance of ViewPoint staff Au, Wi, Sp quarters. Enrollment averaging 30+ students per quarter.

HM 552, Introductory Internship in Hospitality Management: Hotel/Lodging Management, (developed the course), teaching with assistance of hotel/lodging managers, Au, Wi, Sp, Su quarters, Enrollment averaging 30+ students per quarter.

HM 570, Advanced Internship in Hospitality Management, (developed the course). Taught each quarter with industry support. Enrollments currently range from 15-35 per quarter.

HM 660, Personnel and Organization in Hospitality Management. Taught in Au and Sp quarters. Enrollment of 80-90 students per year. SEI scores average 4.6/5.0

HM 661, Special Events Planning and Management, (Developed initially with Parsa, but completely revised the course in 2002 to integrate management of ViewPoint into the course), Taught Au, Wi, Sp quarters. Enrollments currently average 30 students per offering quarter. Average SEI scores have been 4.8/5.0.

HM 700, Issues and Strategies in Hospitality Management, (developed the course to reflect and address current issues in the hospitality industry. Spring quarter. Enrollments reaching 70-75, and projected for 80-90 this year. SEI scores average 4.8/5.0.

HM 593, 793, 993 Independent Studies for undergraduates (mostly honors), master's and doctoral students. Enrollments vary, typically 3-6 students per year.

Other recent teaching:

HNFM 210, The Science of Human Nutrition, Co-developed the course with another faculty member, and secured inclusion as a biological sciences course in the GEC. Taught 2-3 sections per year, with enrollments above 300 per section offered. SEI scores averaged above 4.5/5.0 over entire time, placing in the 95th percentile for course that large.

HM 504, Nutrition Education, 1997-1999, 40-50 students per section. 4.7/5.0 SEI scores
