1. Completion of 60 quarter hours with a cumulative grade point average of 2.75 or higher
2. Completion of the following courses with a grade of B- or higher:
 - o English 110
 - o Math 105
 - o EDU PAES 271 with 289.01 First Education Experience Program (FEEP)
 - o EDU PAES 251 Introduction to The Special Education Profession (with field experience)
3. Documentation of experience with individuals with special needs
4. Three letters of recommendation
5. Successful interview with Special Education faculty

STUDENT TEACHING REQUIREMENTS

- Minimum grade of C- or higher must be earned in all Special Education courses (Content, Core, Reading and Strand courses) in order to enroll in Supervised Student Teaching in Special Education (EDU PAES 798.11, 798.12, 798.13)
- Minimum 2.75 cumulative grade point average required to enroll in Supervised Student Teaching in Special Education (EDU PAES 798.11, 798.12, 798.13)

ACADEMIC STANDARDS REQUIRED TO BE RECOMMENDED FOR STATE OF OHIO TEACHER LICENSURE

- Minimum 2.75 cumulative grade point average at time of graduation
- Minimum grade of C- or higher must be earned in all Special Education courses (Content, Core, Reading and Strand courses)

Note: Unless otherwise specified, courses are to be selected from the School of PAES approved GEC list. If GEC and major courses do not total 196 credit hours, students will need to fulfill remaining hours with elective courses.
