ACCREDITATION UPDATE

We continue to collect data and information for the Spring 2015 visit. Presently, we are seeking demographic data from University Supervisors and Cooperating Teachers. We are missing data from over 500 cooperating teachers from this academic year.

OAE TEST RETAKE CHANGES

As of July 2014, students will be permitted to retake the OAE every 30 days (now it is every 60 days).

edTPA UPDATES

Submission and Scoring Update

Congratulations to all 263 candidates who submitted their portfolios for national scoring during Spring 2014 semester! Thank you to all of the program managers, faculty, and graduate students who supported the candidates as they completed their edTPA portfolios.

We have already received scores for the majority of our candidates and we are proud to report that 29% of the scores were 50 and above. The national recommendation for a passing score is 37 - 42.

edTPA Acceptable Forms of Support

During student teaching, there are guidelines for supporting student teachers. For example, <u>acceptable support</u> is: "Asking probing questions about candidates' draft edTPA responses or video recordings, without providing direct edits of the candidate's writing or providing candidates with specific answers to edTPA prompts."

However, <u>unacceptable support</u> is "Editing a candidate's official materials prior to submission" or "Offering critique of candidate responses that provides specific, alternative responses, prior to submission for official scoring." The new guidelines for support were released in April 2014 and can be found on the AACTE website or in the OSU edTPA Group Buckeye Box folder.

edTPA Terminology

Planned supports include instructional strategies, learning tasks and materials, and other resources deliberately designed to facilitate students' learning of the central focus.
