The Accelerated Superintendent Licensure Program is directed by Dr. Jack Conrath. Dr. Conrath has served public education for 50 years as a teacher and superintendent. His writing and presentations include topics such as the purpose of schooling, student motivation and discipline, and student learning. He is past president of Ohio ASCD, The Ohio Association of Local School Superintendents and of the Marion, Ohio, and Edgerton, Ohio Rotary Clubs.

Superintendents' Licensure Program

The purpose of the Accelerated Superintendent Licensure Program is to positively impact pre-K-12 education through the expertise of faculty members and experienced superintendents, supported by the values and brand of The Ohio State University.

The program uses a cohort model and an accelerated time format which provides an opportunity for students to develop relationships throughout Central Ohio. On this 10th anniversary of the Accelerated Superintendent Licensure Program, over 100 students have completed the program and during the 2013-2014 academic year 13 students are enrolled.

Evidence for Diverse P-12 Placements

In a random sample of P-12 placements, we found that 100% of all sampled candidates had at least one diverse P-12 placement. Diversity was defined as greater than the 2012 National Center for Education Statistics means for race, free lunch, English Language Learners, or disability in P-12 schools. In addition, more than 90% of all completers were placed in more than one diverse P-12 school setting and nearly 70% are in more than two.

We feel this finding supports the decentralization of program recommended placements and also is indicative of programs' careful planning to ensure all candidates have experiences in diverse settings. Congratulations to everyone!

- 4) Developing and executing objectives, based on continuous assessment, that support student learning;
- 5) Practicing integrity and ethical behavior; and
- 6) Engaging in professional development.

New! Forms for Student Teaching

A special thank you to everyone for using the Student Teaching Evaluation Forms during 2013-2014. The forms have been updated for use this fall. In addition, all supervisors are required to upload documentation of their minimum of six (6) observations during student teaching. The form is available on TK20. Supervisors may upload program-approved observation forms or may use the form in TK20. A minimum of 3 observations must be aligned with the Ohio Standards for the Teaching Profession, which is to be noted on the TK20 form. If program approved, a supervisor may virtually supervise. However, a minimum of four (4) observations must be face-to-face.

edTPA Terminology

Respect: A positive feeling of esteem or deference for a person and specific actions and conduct representative of that esteem. Respect can be a specific feeling of regard for the actual qualities of the one respected. It can also be conduct in accord with a specific ethic of respect. Rude conduct is usually considered to indicate a lack of respect, whereas actions that honor somebody or something indicate respect. Note that respectful actions and conduct are culturally defined and may be context dependent.
