FACULTY/STAFF SPOTLIGHT: DR. BELINDA GIMBERT



Dr. Belinda Gimbert

Dr. Belinda Gimbert is an associate professor of educational administration in the Department of Educational Studies. Her research addresses issues related to strategic management of human resources in chronically, low performing and hard to staff school systems. She teaches courses related to strategic management of P-12 human capital, introduction to educational administration, and K-12 supervision. Prior to becoming faculty at Ohio State, she taught mathematics and computing science for 15 years in secondary schools (Grades 7-12) in rural New South Wales, Australia and served as a member of the school administrative team.

Dr. Gimbert is the principal investigator for two U.S Department of Education, Office of Innovation and Improvement grants, Project KNOTtT (2007-2013) and Mobilizing National Educator Talent (m-NET, 2011-2016), that transition 1,656 participants to teaching, while addressing the national issue of teacher quality. M-NET will attain three program performance measures: (1) 95% of all m-NET teachers will become teachers of record (TOR) in high-need schools, (2) 85% will receive full state certification within three years of enrolling in the project, and (3) 80% of m-NET TORs will retain their positions for at least three years in high-need, hard-to-staff school districts.

CLINICAL PRACTICE STATISTICS

On average, how many candidates are eligible for clinical practice each semester or year? What percent, on average, complete clinical practice successfully? Over the past two years:

2012 - 2013:

407 students entered clinical practice

397 students successfully completed (97.5%)

2013 - 2014:

469 students entered clinical practice

461 students successfully completed (98.2%)

Thus, there are approximately 440 students per year eligible for clinical practice, and about 97.9% complete clinical practice successfully.

Discourse: Discourse includes the structures of written and oral language, as well as how members of the discipline talk, write and participate in knowledge construction. Discipline-specific discourse has distinctive features or ways of structuring oral or written language (text structures) that provide useful ways for the content to be communicated.
