FACULTY/STAFF SPOTLIGHT: DR. HELEN MALONE



DR. HELEN MALONE

Dr. Helen Malone is an associate professor in special education and currently oversees the BSEd programs in mild/moderate, moderate/intensive, and early childhood special education. Students in the special education program are trained to teach students with disabilities across age and disability spectrums. Intervention Specialist candidates participate in extensive field experiences in elementary and secondary schools in the Columbus Metropolitan area, resulting in 180 hours of classroom experience prior to student teaching.

Use of Data in Special Education

Dr. Malone states, "Data from the review of the edTPA assessments indicated that our candidates needed strengthening in the area of analytical and reflective writing. A review of our program allowed us to identify areas where we could provide additional practice in this area. Across the curriculum, we added additional assignments to provide additional writing opportunities to practice reflecting on and analyzing their performance and that of their P-12 learners while accessing the curriculum."
