

FACULTY/STAFF SPOTLIGHT: DR. RUTH LOWERY



Dr. Ruth McKoy Lowery is professor of children's literature and literacy, and program coordinator of the Department of Teaching and Learning at The Ohio State University at Mansfield. Dr. Lowery received her PhD from Pennsylvania State University and her MEd and B.A. in English from Florida Atlantic University. Her research incorporates studies of students' responses to literature, the incorporation of multicultural literature for children and adolescents in schools' curricula, West Indian immigrant populations and their adjustment in American, Canadian and British schools, and preparing pre-service teachers to teach diverse student populations.

Dr. Lowery is responsible for overseeing licensure and non-licensure programs. She sees her role as highlighting the work of faculty, staff and students,

and working to expand the MEd program, with the goal of providing diverse learning experiences that will ultimately prepare preservice and in-service teachers to meet the needs of all students they teach.

Based on students' performance in their writing courses and input from faculty, Mansfield's Department of T&L is providing opportunities to strengthen student writing in many of their courses well before students are enrolled in the licensure program. Early in the program, for example, students write reflectively about their field work in area classrooms. Later in their methods courses, when the reflective writing assignments require clear articulation of why and how their choice of a particular practice connects to a specific theory, they are concise with their evidence and clear in their thinking.

OAE COMPETENCY RESULTS AVAILABLE IN APRIL 2015

Pearson is releasing competency level results for our programs and for candidates that do not pass the Ohio Assessments for Educators (OAE) tests beginning in May 2015. These results will enable programs to examine content competencies and evaluate strengths and weaknesses in the preparation of candidates. Additionally, for those candidates that do not pass the OAE, detailed analysis will be available for use by programs. The "look" of test results in Buckeye Box will be slightly different than it is now, to accommodate the new data.

UTEC UPDATE

UTEC discussed trends pertaining to undergraduate students entering college with college credit. There has been a significant increase in the last few years, as more students look for ways to lessen college expenses. As the Ohio College Credit Plus program is implemented, these numbers are expected to increase with an expectation of college completion in three years. Effective long-range academic planning and careful consultation with academic advisors are essential for these students.

MILITARY VETS OR SPOUSES ELIGIBLE FOR APPLICATION FEE WAIVERS

Military vets or spouses that apply for a teaching license will have licensure application fees waived by the State of Ohio. If one is taking the Ohio Assessments for Educators, the fee may either be waived or reimbursed if the vet is eligible for the GI bill.

Do not upload blank files. If candidates do not have an additional piece of evidence to attach for Task 3 Part B, please make sure they do not upload a blank file as a place holder. A safeguard has been put into place to protect students from accidentally uploading an empty file and their edTPA portfolio cannot be uploaded.

Tip #4: General Tips & Getting Started

Decide on a backup plan. Computer crash? All files lost. It's happened and you don't want it to happen to you. So decide on a backup plan and use it. Get a flashdrive and use it for NOTHING else. Save backup copies on more than one computer. Email files to yourself. Create a cloud account. Follow your backup plan often!
