LATEST VERSION OF MODULE 1

The latest version of the Module 1 course (Educator Preparation Standards Module) is available on the Ed Prep website, in the middle of the <u>Field Placement</u> page. There are step-by-step instructions on how to access the module, downloading to iTunes, as well as a list of all Unit topics.

STUDENT TEACHING AND FIELD EXPERIENCE OBSERVATION ASSESSMENT UPDATE

The student teaching and advanced field experience forms will now be sent out as an Observation document through Tk20. The form and evaluation methods will remain the same, but the way it is accessed in Tk20 will look different for university supervisors.

The new method of using Observation documents is outlined in a step-by-step document named "Assessing an Observation."

After distribution, data summaries will be provided weekly for program managers/faculty leads. These files will be available through the Buckeye Box.

Tk20 training for Graphite (initial and advanced levels) will be on:

- Wednesday, September 7, from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. in Ramseyer 329.
 - The first hour will cover basic functionality for faculty and supervisors, as well as a brief overview from the student's perspective so faculty can see what a student sees.
 - The second hour will focus on Tk20 functionalities, such as reports, transitions points, etc.

We will also be recording the session, which will become available online through the Office of Educator Preparation website.

FIELD PLACEMENT FOR OHIO STATE STUDENTS

Do you have students who will be working in P-12 settings (schools/agencies)? If so, please make sure there is an agreement contract with the Office of Educator Preparation (for the Columbus campus). There are implications for not having a contract, such as insurance coverage, verification of course requirement, proper student documentation on file, to name a

NEW READING TEST FOR EARLY, MIDDLE, AND EARLY CHILDHOOD INTERVENTION SPECIALISTS

Beginning in Fall of 2017, all early childhood, middle childhood, and early childhood intervention specialists (early childhood special education) licensure students will be required to take an Ohio Assessment for Educator (OAE) reading test. Even though it is not required until 2017, districts have informed us they will give hiring preference to students that have passed this particular test. Competencies for this test may be found here. The test will be available in fall of 2016 and is based on a test from Massachusetts.
