COOPERATING TEACHER SURVEY FEEDBACK

In late October, the Office of Ed Prep distributed the Cooperating Teacher/Mentor Survey for all programs that had student teachers in summer and fall 2017. Here are the key takeaways from the 77 responses of the 133 surveyed (58% response rate):

Overall, CTs/mentors appreciated or wanted:

- 1. Clear expectations and guidance about their role and their student teachers
 - 52% of responders stated they received training about their role while 48% stated they did not.
 - CTs reported thorough training structures as a strength. Even when training was provided, CTs requested further clarification and assistance, especially on how to handle sticky situations such as underperforming or late student teachers.
- 2. Resources to reference throughout the semester
 - Similarly, when concrete resources were provided as reference from the trainings, they appreciated and used them.

- If they can be helpful, the <u>OEP 2016-17 Student Teaching Handbook</u> and <u>Co-planning/Co-teaching</u> documents are on Buckeye Box. Please feel free to use for your program-specific handbook and/or share this information as you see fit.
- 3. Early and consistent contact with the supervisor
 - CTs who met with the supervisor in-person early in the semester felt they had a stronger relationship to support the student teacher.

Who are our CTs/mentors?

Demographic and other pertinent information such as years of experience can be found in the <u>Data Visualization</u> file in Buckeye Box. When you look at this data, ask yourself what does this information tell us? How can we ensure our teacher candidates have relevant, diverse experiences? How can we better meet the needs of our mentors/cooperating teachers?

Take-aways:

Is your program...

- onboarding cooperating teachers/mentors?
- providing the cooperating teacher / mentor with resources from the beginning of the term?



- requiring university supervisor to visit the CT within the first two weeks?

Breakdown of School Placement Type:

- PreK = 1.3%
- Elementary School = 58.4%
- Intermediate School = 1.3%
- Middle School = 19.5%
- High School = 6.5%
- K-8 = 10.4%
- P/K-12 = 2.6%

Note: 95% are public school placements; 5% are private school placements

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT THE VOUCHER PROGRAM

Definitions used for vouchers:

Ed Prep Voucher Fee - the fee charged to students on their Statement of Account (university bill) *Ed Prep Voucher Code* - the OAE or edTPA code given to students who have paid the Ed Prep Voucher Fee

Note: Tk20 does not require a special code. The account may be activated using their OSU ID number.

UPDATES FROM THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION / HIGHER EDUCATION

Consistently high-performing teacher designation impacts professional license renewal requirements

With adoption of State Board of Education language defining consistently highperforming teachers, certain educators with <u>professional</u>, <u>lead professional or senior</u> <u>professional</u> teaching licenses may not need to complete additional coursework or equivalent continuing education credits to renew their educator licenses for the next renewal cycle. This began January 18, 2017.

ODE Changes Waiting Period for Licensure Applications

ODE has changed the waiting period applications are allowed in the SAFE system. Licensure applications can only be in the system for 60 days. Students can begin to apply at the end of April if they wish to have their application recommended and approved before July 1, 2017.
