

Ohio State Advanced Licensure Test Pass Rates

CAEP Accountability Measure #3: Candidate Competency at Program Completion

Ohio State’s Advanced programs use passage rates on the state licensure tests as a main measure to track candidates’ competency at program completion. School Psychology candidates must pass the PRAXIS 5402 School Psychology exam and Principal candidates must pass the Ohio Assessments for Educators (OAE) 015 Educational Leadership test to be eligible for Ohio licensure. Completers from both programs take their assessment at the conclusion of their program.

Note: Candidates who intend to move out of state may elect to take other exams if they do not plan to seek Ohio licensure. Superintendent candidates are required to hold a Principal license prior to admittance; therefore, 100% will have passed the OAE 015 Educational Leadership test that Ohio requires. Ohio does not require a licensure test for a Pupil Services license in Orientation & Mobility.
