

# Ohio State CCAST Data Results

*CAEP Accountability Measure #3 – Candidate Competency at Program Completion*

Ohio State initial licensure candidates complete the Candidate Performance Assessment of Student Teaching (CPAST) assessment midway and at the end (final) of their student teaching field experience. The form contains four performance levels: Does Not Meet Expectations (0), Emerging (1), Meets Expectations (2) and Exceeds Expectations (3). Candidate performance is determined during a three-way conference with the candidate, cooperating teacher and university supervisor. Across all licensure areas, a 2.0 mean target is set for all rows as a unit-wide benchmark, and those below are areas of focus.

Over time, Ohio State’s overall average performance is comparable (within 0.1 points) or exceeds State benchmarks for all areas. Additionally, 90% or more of students meet expectations in all rows since 2019.
