- 1. Greeting and introductions
 - Welcome by Erica Brownstein
 - Introductions
- 2. New Business
 - Developed Module I which addresses state-wide requirements for all licensure areas such as the Ohio Professional Development Standards, Ohio Standards for the Teaching Profession, Ohio Resident Educator Program, and Ohio Operating Standards
 - o It is complete and has been well received throughout the state
 - o Will be shared with other IHEs what components to be re-branded
 - o Fits with our land grant mission to serve the State of Ohio
 - Module II: Dyslexia Module
 - Is also being developed in iTunes U and addresses the new state curriculum requirements for dyslexia for all initial licenses. Those programs with a 12 hour reading core (early childhood education, middle childhood education, and intervention specialists) address those dyslexia standards in the phonics course. All other initial licensure programs will take Module II.
 - When completed, will be shared with the public and private IHEs in Ohio
 - New CAEP requirements
 - o Assessments must be valid and reliable
 - Race to the Top funds (\$149K) will be used to develop valid and reliable instruments for initial licensure programs at the Unit level and for specific individual programs, starting with secondary mathematics (AYA Math)
 - Public and private institutions have been invited to join and work will begin this summer

 - They will read our initial report in September 2014 and then the final report will be submitted December 2014
