GUEST HEALTH & SAFETY

Whether you've visited Ohio State before or it's your first time, we want to make sure that you feel confident in our commitment to your well-being. We are taking steps to keep our visitors safe and healthy — and we can all make a difference for each other. The information and resources below will not only help keep you safe, but will also help you ensure the health and safety of others.

Physical Distancing

- Guests should maintain a distance of at least 6 feet from others in any public space.
- Decreased room capacities have been established in our meeting rooms and event spaces.
- Signage will be posted in the facility as a reminder.

Mask requirements

- Face masks must be worn properly (over nose, mouth and chin) in indoor settings, unless actively eating or drinking.
- Masks must also be worn outdoors, even when individuals can maintain 6 feet or more of physical distancing.

Cleaning & Disinfecting

- High touch surfaces will be cleaned regularly throughout the day.
- In addition to restrooms, hand sanitization stations have been implemented.

Food and Beverage

- Meals will be monitored by staff and will follow the current university, state of Ohio, and CDC guidelines.

Contact Tracing

- All programs must maintain accurate participation and attendance logs for use with potential contact training.

Daily Health Checks

- All Ohio State employees are required to submit a daily assessment of symptoms and temperature.
- Guests are not required to complete a daily health check, but it is advised that guests stay home if they have any of the following symptoms:
 - A fever of 100°F or higher
 - Respiratory symptoms, such as dry cough or shortness of breath
 - Vomiting or diarrhea
 - Muscle or body ache
 - Chills
 - Loss of taste or smell
